MOVIE NIGHT AT SKYPARK!

The "Blue Max", a coveted medal for achievement in flying, is ruthlessly sought by Peppard, a poor-boy German soldier who climbs out of the trenches and into the aristocratic air force. He is met with prejudice by the other contestants, wealthy snobs who (look down on the lower class soldier). The Blue Max is highly unusual among Hollywood films, not just for being a large-scale drama set during the generally overlooked World War I, but in concentrating on air combat as seen entirely from the German point of view. The story focuses on a lower-class officer. Bruno Stachel (George Peppard), and his obsessive quest to win a Blue Max, a medal awarded for shooting down 20 enemy aircraft. Around this are subplots concerning a propaganda campaign by James Mason's pragmatic general, rivalry with a fellow officer (Jeremy Kemp), and a love affair with a decadent countess (Ursula Andress). As directed by John Guillermin (who later made The Battle of Britain in 1969), the film's main assets are epic production values, great flying scenes, and stunning dogfights. The weak point is the sometimes ponderous character drama, not helped by Peppard, who is too lightweight an actor to convince as the driven antihero. Clearly influenced by Kubrick's Paths of Glory (1958), The Blue Max is a cold, cynical drama offering a visually breathtaking portrait of a stultified society tearing itself

apart during the final months of the Great War. –Gary S. Dalkin

Treasurer's Financial Report: Bank Balance is \$6,520.15

Director Darrel Jones has been working on the revisions to the Chapter bylaws to bring them into conformance with the national EAA guidelines. He will submit an amendment form of the Chapter Articles of Incorporation to the California Secretary of State to change the name of the Chapter to "Sonoma Skycrafters EAA Chapter 1268". Currently the Chapter name is different on four different documents. The cost of filing the amendment is \$30. The bylaws revisions will be sent to the voting members for their approval as soon as they are returned from the national EAA office after their review and approval. The Chapter is applying to the Internal Revenue Service for formal 501.c.3 non-profit status. The attorney's review will cost \$250 and the filing will cost \$400. The Board of Directors voted to approve the expenditures.

The members were asked to help with the expense of sending five young people to this year's Air Academy by making whatever contribution they can. Chapter has \$740 in Young Eagles credits to apply to tuition, room and board. The total cost to send five kids will be about \$5,800. Gary MacDonald generously donated \$400 to the scholarship fund.

He talked about various aspects of the ham radio hobby and announced the annual VOMARC Hamfest and breakfast to be held at the Sonoma Veterans' Building, 126 First Street West, here in Sonoma, on Saturday April 30, from 8 a.m. to noon. The hamfest will include a \$6 breakfast from 8 to 10, an electronics swap meet, an operating radio station and other displays and presentations. Admission is free.

DON CARTER FLIES WEST

Don Price Carter was born on Oct. 3, 1927, to Homer and Margaret (Price) Carter in Liberty Township, Ohio. After growing up on the family farm, he enlisted in the Army Air Corps and served in Japan during World War II. Upon his return from the war, he earned an engineering degree from Purdue University. He accepted a job with Weirton (National) Steel in West Virginia, and soon transferred to San Francisco, where he met his loving wife, Anne (Zeman). They married in the city in 1970, enjoyed 26 years together before her passing and raised three children in the bay area.

His love of airplanes and flying became a true passion for Don at a very young age. He treasured flying his antique airplanes throughout California and the rest of the country, and was a regular at many air shows in the west where he could dazzle onlookers with his aerobatic feats. His collector vehicles and vintage motorcycles were also close to his heart; he cherished riding all across the United States with his motorcycle buddies.

Don was also an avid water and snow skier and enjoyed many trips to the mountains with close friends throughout the years.

Don passed away at the age of 83 on March 20, 2011, at his home in Sonoma.

He is survived by his children, Kim Carter, of Sonoma; Ryann (and Noah) Pressler, of Flower Mound, Texas; and Lindy Carter, of San Francisco; two grandchildren, Grant and Grace Pressler; brother, Jerry (and Marge) Carter, of Hamilton, Ohio; sister, Velma Griffithof Franklin, Ohio; brother-inlaw, Dave Meyer, of West Chester, Ohio; as well as numerous nieces and nephews. He is predeceased by his parents; wife, Anne; sister, Doris Meyer; and brother-in-law. Rollie Griffith. He will be fondly remembered as a loving husband, cherished father, adored "grandpa" and loyal brother and friend who led quite an extraordinary life and is now flying higher than ever before.
