"Paul Seibert (Curtiss Junior) and Ron Price (Fleet 1) flew from Broadhead WI to Blakesberg IA for the annual Antique Airplane Association Fly In over Labor Day weekend.



Pictured are Paul And Bob Taylor, President Antique Airplane Assn. with the Curtiss Jr. which Bob had last flown in 1955. Bob wrote an article about the flight entitled "Paddling Around in a Curtiss Jr. Pusher" which appeared the AAA Magazine in 1956. Paul was honored to receive the Robert L. Taylor Award for bringing the Curtiss Jr."

The 420 mile Broadhead-Blakesberg-Broadhead round trip flight took 7:40 with two fuel stops in each direction due to the limited range of the Jr. with nine gallons of fuel on board. This was Paul's first solo cross country in the Jr. and was flown mostly at 500 ft. AGL with a climb to 1000 ft to cross the Mississippi River at Savanna Ill on the return leg.

The Jr. has flown 24:45 hours since Paul and Ron picked her up in Dixon III in Oct 2010. She has given lots of rides and lots of smiles in the past year.
