# MOVIE NIGHT AT SKYPARK

The November movie is my favorite. The following is from Wikipedia.

Only Angels Have Wings (1939) is a movie directed by <u>Howard Hawks</u>, starring <u>Cary</u> <u>Grant</u> and <u>Jean Arthur</u>. It is generally

regarded as being among Hawks' finest films, particularly in its portrayal of the professionalism of the pilots, its atmosphere, and the flying sequences.



Geoff Carter (Grant) is a pilot and the manager of a small, barely solvent air service owned by "Dutchy" Van Reiter (Sig Ruman) carrying mail from the South American port town of Barranca over the Andes Mountains. Bonnie Lee (Arthur), a piano-playing entertainer, arrives one day and becomes infatuated with Carter, despite his fatalistic attitude about the dangerous mountain flying, and stays on in Barranca (not at Carter's invitation, as he insists on telling her).

The situation is complicated by the appearance of Bat MacPherson (Richard Barthelmess) and his wife Judy (Rita Hayworth). MacPherson is a pilot shunned by other fliers because he once bailed out of a plane, leaving his mechanic — the brother of 'Kid' Dabb (Thomas Mitchell), Carter's best friend — to be killed in the resulting

crash. Carter needs pilots badly, but he is unwilling to hire MacPherson even so. However, when Judy begs him to give her husband a chance, he gives in, with the understanding that MacPherson will get the most dangerous flights.

I'm not going to tell any more of the story. You'll just have to join us Friday November 18 and see it for yourself. You miss this one, you're going to kick yourself for a long ol' time.

### **DECEMBER MEETING/XMAS PARTY**

The December meeting will once again be a combined EAA Chapter 1268 and Sonoma Skypark shareholders Christmas party.

The dinner and party will be held on <u>Friday</u>, <u>December 2</u>, and will be in Ron Price's hangar on Row A behind the clubhouse. We have had the party there in the past and it has always been a great venue.

Instead of a white elephant exchange this year there will be a multimedia show commemorating Sonoma Skypark's twenty-fifth anniversary as a privately owned public use airport.

Sonoma Skypark was started in 1967 by John Thomas on leased land and continued through different management until the death of John Tate, who was the last operator of the airport.

After John's death the owners, who were not pilots and who lived outside Sonoma Valley put the property up for sale as commercial/light industrial real estate, since the Eighth Street East corridor was developing as Sonoma Valley's industrial and commercial district.

At the same time the owners of the property Fremont Airport was on sold that property for a shopping center development. Ron Price, John and Kathy Carmichael and other Fremont pilots put together a limited corporation to buy the Sonoma Skypark property and started selling shares to local pilots.

The happy ending to this story is that Sonoma Skypark is not covered with warehouses and has developed into a premier flying community with a strong social orientation.

Kathy Carmichael is putting together a celebration of the airport and has asked people to contribute photos and memories of Sonoma Skypark for the evening's program. If you have something you can contribute, please give Kathy a call at (707)935-7940.

We will be collecting toys for Toys For Tots at the party. Information on the time and who brings what will be sent after the meeting Tuesday.
