We need about six to eight members at Skypark at 3 in the afternoon that day to move chairs and to help set up.

Jeff Skiles, EAA's Vice President of Communities and Member Programs would like to come to the Sonoma/Napa/Vacaville and Sacramento/Auburn areas April 2-3 (as well as San Carlos on April 1) for the spring schedule of EAA's Grass Roots Pilot Tours. These free events bring together EAA chapters for a presentation focusing on your organization. EAA sends invitations (about 500) to all EAA members and licensed pilots within a 25- to 50mile radius of the host site. Tour stops are listed on the EAA website (www.eaa.org/grassroots) with the ability to RSVP electronically. All local pilots are invited to attend so we can engage more aviators, invite them to be a part of the EAA, and participate in aviation by joining and supporting their local EAA chapters. This is a great way to promote your chapter and expose your chapter members to a broader segment of the aviation community, as well as an opportunity to get to know members of neighboring chapters. Ideally Jeff would present a program each evening; perhaps one in either Sonoma, Napa or Vacaville on

Wednesday or Thursday; and one Sacramento or Auburn the other evening. It is a great opportunity for chapters in an area to work together to coordinate the event.

If your chapter is interested in supporting a Grass Roots Pilot Tour, this is what we would need from you:

1 - A location that could hold 100 - 125 people.2 - A projector, screen, and sound system for a PowerPoint presentation. Jeff will bring his own laptop.
