EAA 1268 MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN AND TREASURER REPORT August 2014

Membership Report: Activity in the membership department has been relatively quiet here in the summer months. We currently have 58 paid up members including 8 Associate members and 8 Air Explorers who are given complimentary membership by our chapter. We had one new member sign up in July – Kirstin Dahm, who you may also know as Rich and Nelleke Cooper's daughter.

It would be nice if we could get our membership and chapter attendance increased and one of those ways is through the EAA trial membership program.

This program allows a potential EAA national member to enjoy the experience of being a fullfledged member for 6 months at no cost. Among the privileges enjoyed during this time period is the *EAA Sport Aviation* magazine, access to the members-only area of the website, membership discounts on programs like EAA SportAir workshops, EAA AirVenture Oshkosh and more.

If the potential member likes what they see on this "test drive" they're invited to become a regular member. In addition to being a National EAA member, we at EAA1268 also extend a no cost membership during this trial "look us over" period. If you know of any potential member, give me their contact information and I'll take it from there.

Treasurer Report: During the month of July we had one disbursement – a \$920 check to EAA National to cover the balance of tuition due for our chapter-sponsored EAA Air Academy attendees. Funds for this purpose are derived from our fund raisers and contributions from individual donors. Remember, our chapter is an IRC 501c3 organization so any contributions made are fully deductible on your income tax – something nice to have at tax time.

As of July 31 our checking account balance stands at \$11377.05.

AIR EXPLORER UPDATE

The latest from the Aviation Explorers:

Hello EAA members!

Air Explorers has had a variety of activities going during the year, not always well reported by me!

We've had a variety of things going on over the last several months. Ron Price supervised the kids painting new guide lines for 2 hangars. They measured, put down marking tape, then everyone had a turn or two with the spray painter. The hangar owners were very appreciative!

We went for a tour at Reach Helicopter at the Santa Rosa Airport. They specialize in air medical evacuation and transport. That was the most well attended tour we've ever had. Tat's grandson Tim is the lead mechanic there. He came in on his day off and showed us around the hangar, the helicopters, then had the flight crew on duty escort us out to the ramp where we were briefed by both the flight nurse and the pilot about their daily routine, how they preflight their equipment, and how they minimize risk. I asked Tim to explain to the group how to make a good maintenance write up so the mechanic has the best chance to fix the problem with the least amount of frustration. All of the staff also talked a bit about the different missions that they are tasked with performing. Almost on queue at the end of the visit, the flight crew got a call so we were able to see them "saddle up" and take off. Very fun and informative.

We also had a great turnout of the group, along with their parents to help at Family Fun Day. Gillian Shulte and Tina Fasano staffed the booth which allowed the Explorers to help as needed with other tasks around the field. While we didn't make a huge amount of extra money, the booth provided excellent visibility to the community.

This Sunday, Marc Ashton from the Petaluma Airport, is coming to talk to the group about what you need to do to become a commercial pilot (FARs, total time, time requirements, etc.) and how much it can cost. He has been a CFI at Petaluma for quite awhile and will be an excellent resource for them in the future.

For September, we tentatively have a tour of the KC-135 aircraft at Travis Air Force Base scheduled.

Air Explorer Announcement!

Some of you know and most have heard of Daniel Shulte. He has been to Air Academy several times courtesy of EAA 1268, and has treated us with some great presentations about his experiences at Oshkosh. He is the oldest member of the Air Explorer Group. Daniel got his Private license before his driver's license, and is interested in video and film almost as much as he is in aviation and flying. He is currently 19, and will be on his way to college this fall.

Last year he put together a video project for school. Eric Presten and Rich Cooper graciously donated their time and airplanes so that Daniel could get air to air footage. During the process he decided he wanted to make a full length movie presentation about flying, how wonderful it is, and how to get involved. He decided to use the internet site Kickstarter to solicit funds for the film. (If you are not familiar with Kickstarter, google it.)

He shot and edited an introductory video, and after some very long delays with the Kickstarter process, the project went live around August 29. I watched the video (link below) for the first time on August 5th. I knew Daniel and his crew had some talent, but the quality of the introductory video they produced is absolutely top notch. You will see some familiar sites in the video! I am so proud of the effort he has put in and results he has seen this far. He has until about August 29th to raise \$9,000.

I've had a lot of fun working with the kids in this group. Their enthusiasm for aviation is infectious. Daniel is the first to step out with a project of this magnitude, but I know it is going to inspire all the kids in the group. He has invited them to help with filming the project as well as donate money back to the Air Explorer group in the "pay it forward" spirit if the project funds.

If you are inspired by the project, please donate. Donations start at \$5 and are in increments up to \$1,000 with "incentives".

The clock is ticking: He has about 20 days left to meet his funding goal of \$9,000. A lot of very positive and cool things will happen if the project gets funded.
