

#### **MARIN AIRSTRIP FROM THE '40S**

There is a long forgotten airstrip located in Marin County in the Point Reyes National Seashore at Bass Lake (above and to the northwest by 200 yards) out of Palomarin, on Bolinas ridge.

The legend goes something like this: a *commandant*, self-proclaimed I imagine, named Will Tevis during WW II "guarded the coast" on land he owned, from possible Japanese invaders and built a polo / airfield on a bluff above Bass Lake. (From his obituary: William S. Tevis Jr. of San Francisco, an internationally known polo player whose family once owned vast land holdings in Marin, including the 2,500-acre Ranch of the Lakes on the coast between Bolinas and Olema.)

My Dad flew into this strip from his ranch near Black Point. He also said a Bonanza flew in and out of there and may have been based there, although after a visit to this location the "airstrip" looked mighty short from the ocean cliff bluff to the inland knoll.

A second look at the link shows three different Marin airfields; Santa Venetia, the San Rafael strip near the canal, and Hamilton Field.

There was another landing strip in Larkspur behind the current C O M athletic field (now where the soccer field is located). Another was in the field across the street from Drake High! Probably more locations too?? Stinson Beach had a strip, and there was another one in the area north of Bolinas as well.

#### **EAA CHAPTER 1268 MINUTES**

July 12, 2016

The Board meeting was called to order at about 6:00 by President Robin Tatman. Treasurer Bill Wheadon, Young Eagles liaison BK White, Board members Paul Siebert, Jeanette Woods and Darrel Jones were present.

It was announced that there would be no movie night in July because of AirVenture at Oshkosh.

The Air Explorers will do dinner in October. September meeting and dinner will be in Napa at Jack Caldwell's winery. Directions will be in the September newsletter. Bill and Jan Wheadon will provide dinner for November. We still need someone to do dinner in August.

The Board moved to revise the Air Academy application process with the deadline for applications being January 31, and will require applicants to meet with a selection committee of officers and board members in February before participants are selected at the March meeting. It is hoped that these changes will enhance communication with the Air Academy participants and their families.

The Board will ask the Sonoma Skypark Airport Board of Directors to schedule Family Fun Day for 2017 for the Saturday before Memorial Day to avoid conflict with graduation dates for local schools and families. The proposed date will be May 20, 2017.
