Air Explorer Update

For the activity in March we went on a tour of the Oakland Center facility. It's a bit confusing because you would think the facility is at the Oakland Airport, but it actually is on Center Avenue in Fremont, just south of the Dumbarton Bridge. They were very strict about not letting us take pictures, even of the sign in front of the facility. We had a good turnout of 11 Explorers and parents. Unfortunately only 10 of us could go in.

Oakland Center handles traffic all traffic above 18,000 feet from the Nevada/Utah border, north to the California border, continuing west to 160 degrees west (bordering Japan) and south past the Marshall Islands and includes Guam and Fiji. That's a lot of square miles!

We all got to listen in to several sectors - Oceanic traffic around Hawaii, local over Skypark/Santa Rosa, east over Arizona, and north around Red Bluff. Several controllers were in training. They showed us all of the cool tools that they, how they hand off traffic to different sectors, and explained how the different traffic flows were managed. That day they were switching to a south operation because of the incoming storms.

It was a bit like going in to a dark library - very quiet and dim, and there were piles of sugar and caffeine everywhere. Cupcakes, hard candy, chocolate, coffee, and tea to keep everyone awake.

Our guides were 3 new trainees just out of school, so they briefed us on their backgrounds

and how they found their way to becoming controllers. The staff could not have been nicer. All in all, a very informative and fun tour. They prefer small groups, and I have contact information if anyone wants to set up a tour.

Movie Update

EAA CHAPTER 1268 MINUTES

March 14, 2017

The Board meeting was called to order by Darrel Jones at 6:13 pm. Present were Bill Wheadon, Treasurer; Don Booker, Vice President; BK White, Young Eagles liaison; Nelleke Cooper, Secretary; Paul Siebert, Darrel Jones and Jeanette Woods, Board Members, Guest Richard Cooper.

Bill Wheadon, Member Chair reported that the new roster was emailed out to the members. He wasn't sure whether all the email addresses were correct and hopes to hear from those who changed their email addresses in the last year. BK mentioned to shred the old roster or destroy to keep the information from being compromised.

Our checking account has been successfully transferred to Redwood Credit Union and new checks are in our possession.

Treasurer Report: Our account at Redwood CU has \$9704.38 in the checking account and \$100 in the savings account (required to maintain that balance as a credit union). There was no activity other than the initial deposit of \$290 to get the account opened.

BK reported that the weather was beautiful for the March Young Eagles meeting. We flew 23 kids with 3 airplanes. Pilots were Ron Price, Frank Russo and Walt Eastman. Walt has the advantage of being able to fly 3 kids at the same time in his Bonanza, which came in handy considering the # of kids that came out. John Thomason handled the registrations and Paul Siebert was there to assist with the line. Our Chapter 1268 is one of the few and maybe the only one, who gives Young Eagle rides monthly. There was discussion of one of the volunteer pilots, Bill Somers, who has participated in our Young Eagles program in the past, who was written up in the Grass Valley Union Newspaper. Bill has personally

given 1400 free flights to kids all over the country.

Air Academy. Since our last meeting we have added 1 more participant, Julian Ducarroz, for the Air Academy for a total of 4. Tuition for the week is \$5210. Each applicant has applied for a Scholarship from EAA National, and last year all were approved. BK brought \$645 in credits received for flights for 2016. We also had sent in a deposit of \$1200 which will be applied to the costs. Ron Price arranges for the airfare to which a fee for unaccompanied minors may be added.

There was concern about an article in Sonoma Index Tribune regarding a crash in Fresno, referred to as "Aviation Sonoma Style." BK wrote a letter to the editor pointing out that the pilot was not in any way associated with Sonoma Skypark, while promoting our Young Eagles Program and Air Explorers program. He mentioned our safety record by never having had an incident or accident in the \pm 220 rides we give every year.

Ron Price informed us that George Petanque is willing to donate a Cessna 150 to the Chapter under the 501-3c program to give young people the opportunity to learn to fly. Robin Tatman has the paperwork for this and Paul Siebert will contact EAA National on how to proceed.

Ron Price also told us that Michael Brantsig was in Sonoma Valley Hospital last week and most likely has cancer. He will go to UC Davis for further analysis. Our sincere wishes for a successful treatment and complete recovery.

Board meeting adjourned at 7:00 pm Ron Price and Frank Russo provided us with a superb St. Patrick's day dinner of Corn beef, red and green cabbage, and Ron's special potatoes. For dessert there was a beautiful St. Patrick's day cake with lots of frosting. George Thomson brought the wine and Marsi a container of delicious Peet's coffee. Regular meeting called to order by Vice President Don Booker at 8:00 pm.

Items discussed at Board Meeting were presented to the Membership, including Young Eagles report, discussion on BK's letter to Index Tribune and Air Academy.

Bill Wheadon informed the members that if a member didn't pay dues for 2 years their name would be dropped from the membership list.

Concerning the Air Academy there will not be a contribution from the Air Explorers this year as in the past the funds came from the Auction and Raffle at Family Fun Day. However, we have members who contribute regularly towards the scholarships, which is greatly appreciated especially with the loss of the Family Fun Day resources. Ron Price's hamburger fund has been able to pay for most of the airfare, but parents are asked to contribute \$200. Rafe Tomsett's movie fund pays for jackets and hats with 1268 logo for the camp participants.

BK brought up the fact that not only do we give YE flights once a month, but we also encourage kids to come back. As a result we have produced private, military and commercial pilots. This brought up our Chapters mission, which is to try to get young people involved in all aspects of aviation.

Family Fun Day will be held on May 20 this year. Ideas for Family Fun Day. Free hamburgers and all the trimmings, paper airplane contest, Travel Air rides, hay rides, hopefully face painting etc.

Regular meeting adjourned 8:30 pm.
A short movie was shown about Pan Am's flight around the world after the attack on Pearl Harbor in WWII. The Pan Am Boeing-314 flying boat under the command of Captain Robert Ford with a crew of 11 was caught in Noumea in the Pacific. They had a perilous flight of 31,500 miles and reached New York 31 days later. Everybody thought they had vanished and the tower didn't know who they were. An incredible feat chronicled in the book "The Long Way Home," by Ed Dover. A great read for anybody interested in aviation history.
