EAA CHAPTER 1268 MINUTES

EAA 1268 Board of Directors Meeting April 11, 2017

Members present: President Robin Tatman, Vice President Don Booker, Treasurer Bill Wheadon, Directors Jeanette Woods and Darrel Jones

Members absent: Secretary Nelleke Cooper, Director Paul Siebert

6:30 – meeting called to order. Items discussed: Nelleke Cooper's health status, Rich Cooper arrived later and briefed the Board on her condition. He indicated she would probably remain in the hospital for a few more days. He requested any calls to be short and check with him before visiting.

Family Fun Day: New date – May 13 instead of May 20

Hours of FFD: 11am to 3 pm instead of a 9 am start time per the website.

Robin Tatman is point person with Darrel Jones backing up.

Much scaled down fund raising activities – focus will be on fun this year.

No activities dropping things from the air. Bob Berwick hopping rides in his biplane will be OK

Anne Andree Wilson will be doing crepes again this year. Air Explorers will be helping out this year also.

Website: Gretchen McDougall has done an excellent job setting up the website and it can be accessed using either EAA1268.org or EAA1268.com. Rather than bothering Gretchen every time a change or addition needs to be made (e.g. imputing the newsletter) explore training a local chapter member to accomplish this. Perhaps Colin Trainor can assist on the above task prior to Saturday burgers or before an Air Explorer meeting.

President's report: Daniel Schulte's video "For the Love of Flight" will be shown at the Sebastiani Theater in Sonoma on April 23. Doors will open at 12:30 with the viewing beginning at 1. The video is about 40 minutes in length with a Q&A to follow. Robin is trying to get Daniel's video on the program for viewing at Air Venture in Oshkosh this summer.

We have no volunteer cooks for May and speakers are also needed. Robin has obtained a list of speakers from the Petaluma Airport Pilots Association and will follow up on this.

Robin will be working on getting her flight instructor rating reinstated in order to help some of our young aspiring aviators get a start on obtaining their private pilot license.

Possible Flying Club: Paul Siebert has made contact with a person at AOPA and discussed with him the steps involved in setting up a flying club. Paul produced a list of questions to consider before proceeding. A correction to the March minutes should be that the EAA is not a sponsor or involved with the flying club airplane.

Air Academy: We will be sponsoring four attendees this year – Macklyn Liss, Avery

Cruz, Julien Dugaraoz, and Andrew Daigle. Tuition for the attendees had been around \$5,000, but because they had all applied for and received scholarships, our sponsorship has been reduced to \$2875 which includes \$645 in Young Eagle credits. Because of their motivation to attend, demonstrated by obtaining the scholarships, the board voted to waive their obligated \$200 buy-in. Board of Directors meeting adjourned at 7:10.

EAA 1268 General Membership Meeting Minutes April 11, 2017 7:30 pm

President Robin Tatman opened the meeting by thanking Ron Price for filling in as last minute cook by serving a delicious imported lasagna (from Santa Rosa) accompanied by salad and garlic bread. Robin and Marsi contributed with dessert and coffee.

- -Visitors Mark and Marcus Shackford (father and son) introduced themselves. They have a Cessna 170 based at Skypark and a Luscombe at Napa County airport. Both are in pursuit of their private pilot's license and Marcus is planning on continuing his flying with the goal of a career in aviation.
- Robin briefed the meeting on Air Explorer activities they recently had a group tour of Oakland Center (ARTC) in Fremont and are planning a tower visit to Santa Rosa and a possible orientation visit conducted by Daniel Schulte showing what's involved in working on the ramp at the Santa Rosa airport.
- Treasurer's Report: Bill Wheadon gave a brief report on the chapter finances. There were no disbursements and one deposit in the checking account. The deposit was for \$718 and consisted of \$135 in dues renewal, \$550 in donations for the Air Academy, and \$33 in dinner proceeds. Our checking account balance was \$10,402.80 on March 31, 2017.

Announcements:

Ron Price reported the airfare for Air Academy attendees this year is \$2809 and the burger fund is a little short. The chapter has enough in the account to cover the deficit.

John Thomason gave a public commendation to Darrel Jones for all the work he does in enabling such a large number of Air Academy attendees each year. Darrel in turn congratulated the chapter membership by our sponsorship and remarked on how such a small chapter can consistently send 3 or 4 youths to the annual Air Academy and that the focus of our chapter is fostering youth's interest in aviation.

Rich Cooper gave thanks to the group for enabling his son and daughter to pursue and achieve their career goals in aviation.

Skypark airport tenant Bob Berwick will be flying a C41 to the gathering of DC3s and C47s at the Flabob airport on May 19-21. This C41 is a C47 variant used by Air Force General Hap Arnold.

Marsi Fahraji, George Thomson and Les Goldner volunteered to be our May cooks.

FAA Checklist, AOPA Course Ready for BasicMed Implementation

April 24, 2017 - On April 24, the FAA released the final checklist for the physician visit required by BasicMed allowing pilots to visit their regular doctor in preparation for the program's official implementation on May 1. To fly under BasicMed a pilot must have the checklist, called the Comprehensive Medical Examination Checklist (CMEC) by the FAA, signed by a state-licensed physician and kept in the pilot's personal records. AOPA's online medical self-assessment course approved for BasicMed is also now available. AOPA's

course is one of two being offered to satisfy the BasicMed requirement, the other is provided by Mayo Clinic. Mayo Clinic has released a video that discusses some of the highlights of BasicMed and provides a preview of its own medical self-assessment course.

As a reminder, **before** flying under BasicMed beginning May 1, one must:

- Have held a third-class medical certificate or special issuance at any point since July 15, 2006.
 - New pilots and pilots who fall outside the above window must obtain a one-time third-class medical certificate or special issuance before flying under BasicMed.
- Visit any state-licensed doctor and have them review and sign the <u>CMEC</u> during the visit. Retain the CMEC records.
- Take one of the online medical selfassessment courses provided by <u>AOPA</u> or Mayo Clinic. Retain proof of completion.

There is much more to BasicMed than the above requirements. Pilots who wish to start flying under BasicMed on May 1 are strongly encouraged to read FAA <u>Advisory Circular 68-1</u> and EAA's BasicMed <u>FAQs</u>, or visit <u>EAA's BasicMed Resource Center</u>.
