#### MOVIE NIGHT AT SONOMA SKYPARK

Movie night for March is **Saturday, March 24** at 6pm in the Sonoma Skypark clubhouse.

The movie will be "Wings", William Wellman's 1927 World War One classic that has the distinction of winning the first Best Picture Oscar presented at the inaugural Academy Awards.

Starring Richard Arlen, Buddy Rogers and the "It Girl" Clara Bow, it follows two small town young men who have a romantic rivalry as then go to fight in the skies over France.

Not only were real World War I planes used in the aerial scenes, but the actors had to film themselves while actually flying the fighters in the battle shots. Frank Clark was the leading stunt pilot in Hollywood at the time and plays the leader of the German squadron, Lt. Von Brun, flying his Fokker D.VII with a squadron of other D.VIIs as well as "Wichita Fokkers", Travel Airs like the one Bob Berwick flies scenic rides with.

I am especially interested in "Wings" because I have a Fokker D.VII replica I hope to build after I retire.

### EAA CHAPTER 1268 MINUTES

Board of Directors Meeting February 13, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 6:25 by President Robin Tatman. Present were Bill Wheadon, Walt Eastland, BK White and Darrel Jones.

Darrel reported that we have three Air Academy applicants; Nick Griffin, Nathan Wilson and Eirwyn Rogers. Interviews will be scheduled for late February or early March.

Robin reported that the DC-3 flight to Oshkosh won't work with the schedule for the Air Academy participants.

Robin talked about speaking to local middle and high schools about aviation, Young Eagles and careers in aviation.

Robin reported that EAA is not interested in showing Daniel Shulte's film during Airventure.

Robin reported that the March speaker will be Dave Alexander who was involved in the Canary island collision between two airliners.

Bill reported that the Treasurer's report is in the newsletter.

Darrel talked about starting a flying club at Sonoma Skypark that would not be associated with EAA Chapter 1268 but will offer low cost flight instruction to Sonoma Valley youth.

Board Meeting adjourned at 7:00 PM

Dinner was prepared and served by Ernie Ganas and consisted of tri-tip, potatoes, salad, cream puffs and drinks.

The General meeting was called to order at 7:30 PM.

Robin announced that she was through her transition training for the 777 and will be able to be more active in the local Air Explorer post. She asked for volunteers to help with the Post activities and also to talk to students at local schools about careers in aviation. She talked about a flying club as part of the effort to give Sonoma Valley youth opportunities to learn to fly at low cost.

Yayoi talked about a free book mobile that could come to our Young Eagles rallies with books to loan to participants.

Larry Nelson announced that he took his beautifully restored P-19 to the Capitol Air Show in Sacramento and received the Hap Arnold trophy for best restored aircraft. The trophy was presented to Larry by Hap Arnold's grandson.

General Meeting adjourned 8:00 PM

The presentation for the evening was by Avery Cruz, one of Chapter 1268's Air Academy participants. Avery talked about his experiences at Air Academy and showed the members his projects, including a wing rib, spark plug holder and fiberglass clipboard.

Avery was able to learn welding, met many other young people from around the country and had an airplane and helicopter ride with an instructor. He learned about weight and balance and is enthusiastic about continuing in aviation.

Avery finished the evening answering questions from the members.

#### The following is from Paul Seibert

#### February 2018

This month's question: I have never understood why EAA chapters cannot own and fly aircraft as part of the whole chapter organization. Is this something that the EAA voted on at the meeting in Oshkosh? — Carl Bogardus, EAA 114219, Chapter 555 **Answer:** In 2014, EAA explored the approach of allowing EAA chapters to own flying aircraft so that a chapter could form a flying club. This would provide a landing spot for chapter build projects and allow members to have affordable access to flying. There were two determining factors that led us to the rule that chapters cannot operate airworthy aircraft, and the recommendation that members form a flying club outside of the chapter. Ultimately, the expense of the liability insurance required for a chapter-run club

proved to be very cost-prohibitive, defeating the purpose of a flying club. An EAA chapter-sponsored flying club would be required to carry the same hull and liability insurance as any other flying club, which roughly costs between \$3,000 and \$4,000. However, on top of that, chapters would be required to pay an additional \$8,000 of liability insurance to protect the chapter and EAA as a whole. At the end of the day, that number was too high to accept.

In addition to the financial burden, EAA realized there might be potential conflicts of interest within a chapter. In most chapters, many members already own and operate their own aircraft, which means that only a subset of the chapter members would benefit from a chapter-sponsored flying aircraft. Chapters would be spending financial resources, fundraising, and membership dues on a member benefit that only a fraction of the members would use. This could have led to disagreements within a chapter.

Since the process of forming a separate entity for a flying club can seem daunting, EAA is here to help! We can answer any questions you have on forming a nonprofit corporation, becoming tax exempt, and transferring a chapter build to a flying club, and we can also provide sample bylaws and operating guidelines.
