EAA CHAPTER 1268 MINUTES

Minutes of the March 12, 2019 meeting

The meeting was called to order at 6:25 by Vice President Darrel Jones.

Officers and Board members present were BK White, Roland Gangloff, Bill Wheadon and Nelleke Cooper. Darrel took the minutes because Nelleke was preparing dinner.

Roland suggested starting Young Eagles at 10 am instead of 9 and running to 1 pm. BK and the Board will consider his suggestion.

Roland proposed organizing a phone tree to facilitate contacting members about upcoming events, such as Young Eagles. It would be a great advantage in assuring that we have enough volunteers to fly Young Eagles, conduct ground school and register Young Eagles as they arrive. He also proposed creating a formal duty roster and conducting training so Young Eagles volunteers would have a better understanding of the event activities and responsibilities.

Roland and Robin are working on restarting the Air Explorer Post at Sonoma Skypark for young people between the ages of 14 to 19. The last Air Explorers aged out of the Post and some have gone on to careers in aviation.

Darrel reported that he applied for the Chapter authorization for the \$10,000 James Ray Aviation Scholarship administered through the national EAA organization. Only ninety chapters will receive the scholarship to award to young people starting flight training.

Chapter 1268 is 139 on a list of 164, out of a total of nearly 300 chapters applying for the award. EAA is looking for additional funds to enable more chapters to participate in the program. Darrel completed the EAA webinar training to become the Ray Scholarship coordinator for the Chapter.

Darrel reported that the flying club organization is proceeding. He is working on filing for state and federal non-profit status and filing as a non-profit 501.c.7 corporation with the California Secretary of State. The hope is to eventually have three to four airplanes to offer basic and instrument flight instruction to club members at lower cost than commercial flight schools.

The club would also be open to local pilots who can't justify the cost of owning their own airplane but who wish to continue flying.

The club would be a separate entity from the Chapter. Richard Craig, Robin Tatman and Darrel are initially organizing the club, but would welcome other members who would like to be involved. They have purchased John Miles Taylorcraft BC12-D with the intent of offering primary and tailwheel transition training with it. The goal is to eventually lease a hangar large enough to house four airplanes, as well as have space for instructor briefings with students.

BK reported that Chapter 1268 received \$725 in Young Eagles credits from 2018. Chapter 1268 is sponsoring one young person, Fabiola Chavez, to the Air academy this summer. Chapters receive five dollars credit for every Young Eagle flown by pilots with at least ten rides during the year.

The Board meeting was adjourned at 7:00 pm. Dinner was provided by Nelleke and Rich Cooper, and consisted of corned beef, cabbage, carrots, potatoes, Irish cake and coffee, with the real stuff available for the coffee if anyone so desired. Bill Wheadon helped with dinner.

The general membership meeting was called to order at 7:35.

The officers repeated their reports from the Board meeting.

Guests were Ron Hill, brought by Frank Russo, Jorge Oros, one of our early Young Eagles and currently a flight instructor hoping to soon start flying for an air carrier, and Glenn Gathright, from the Oakland FSDO. Glenn will be one of our featured speakers at an upcoming meeting. He can talk about maintenance, operations, certifications and field approvals.

Movie night was announced and will be a crab feed for \$20 per person. Advanced registration is required.

Upcoming events announced were the Travis Air show on the last weekend of March and the EAA Ford Trimotor rides in the area.

Will Campbell brought his beautiful aviation photos for the members to enjoy during dinner.

The general meeting was adjourned at 7:50.

Our speaker was John Shackford, who flew F-84s in Korea and F-86s and B-47s during the cold war. He gave a great presentation about his experiences and answered members' questions during his talk.

Ernie Ganas will serve his signature tri-tip dinner next month, with roasted red potatoes, Caesar salad and French bread.
