EAA 1268 Board of Directors Meeting June 11, 2019

The Board Meeting was called to order by President Robin Tatman at 6:25 pm.

Present were: President Robin Tatman, Vice President Darrel Jones, Treasurer and Membership Chairman Bill Wheadon, Secretary Nelleke Cooper, Directors Jeanette Woods and Roland Gangloff, Young Eagles Coordinator BK White.

Absent: Director, Paul Siebert

Robin asked if there was a further update on the status of the Classic/Antique aircraft display exemption. Apparently, nobody had received a notice that the exemption was denied. Bill Wheadon mentioned that it is in the

interpretation of the wording, "What is considered General Transportation?" At Sonoma Skypark, Young Eagles and Display day are usually on the same day.

Treasurer's Report June 2019

Chapter 1268 monetary assets reside in three accounts at the Redwood Credit Union: Checking account -\$7094.47 Savings Account -\$101.72 Certificate of Deposit account - \$5014.52

These three accounts total \$12,210.71.

We also have \$7805.40 in non-chapter funds in the savings account that is being held for the Jack Strehl memorial fund.

BK White reported that June 9 was busier than usual. They flew 26 kids with 5 pilots and 5 airplanes. The pattern had to be changed due to the weather as it was bumpy over the hills. Pilots flying were Robin Tatman in her Cessna 120, Darrel Jones in Jeanette Wood's Cessna 172, Don Booker in his Cherokee, Tim Bloodgood in his light sport Remos and Josh Redsun. Ground volunteers Roland Gangloff, Marsi Fahraji, John Thomason, BK White on the flight line, Ron Willis and Gretchen McDougal.

Roland is coordinating a phone tree. Jeanette Woods has a list of the pilots and volunteers she created and will supply Roland with the list. Roland proposed dividing up the list and coordinating the list of volunteers the Friday before and Robin advocated having a more formal briefing prior to flying. Also, the procedure should definitively include ground school prior to flying.

Glenn Gathright of the FAA will be our Speaker for July and Gene Marcinkowski for November. The list for Speakers for the remainder of the year is complete. Darrel Jones made a motion, second by Bill Wheadon for a \$1000 scholarship for flight training for Fabiola Chavez. Fabiola is the recipient of our Oshkosh Academy this year. For next year we have set aside funds for 6 spots at the Air Academy. Ken Mercer from the Napa Chapter will give us their credits towards the scholarship for Young Eagles they flew.

Roland suggested finding a way to coordinate meeting at the Oshkosh Air Venture for our group, such as making a sign at Ron Price's tent.

Board Meeting adjourned 7:00 pm

General Meeting called to order by President Robin Tatman at 7:50 pm

Robin thanked Wayne and Celia Schake and Don and Lee Booker for a delicious dinner of carnitas (pulled pork,) Spanish rice, beans, jalapeños and Salad. Chocolate covered ice cream bars for dessert!

Family Fun Day is officially rescheduled for September 21 this year.

The officers gave their reports to the Membership.

The first official Air Explorer meeting for this year was quite successful with 4 boys and 4 girls attending. Coordinators: Robin Tatman, Roland Gangloff, Ron and 2 parents.

Kristin Gregory of the Napa Air Explorers has a contact at the Travis Air Force Heritage Museum in Vacaville. Robin has a request in to see if our group could be including in the field trip.

The membership was informed of the approved scholarship of \$1000 for flight training for Fabiola. The paperwork for the flying club is getting closer to be completed.

Oshkosh AirVenture dates 7/22-7/28 and the Pietenpol Fly-in at Brodhead 7/19-7/20.

Robin asked if anyone had an update on our Member Mike Harris. Mike has been active at Skypark for many years. He owned a Pitts airplane and used to race at the Reno Air Races. He flew a DC6 in Laos before the Vietnam War and spent part of his career at Japan Air Lines.

Presentation by Richard and Nelleke Cooper about landing at the old Kai Tak Airport in Hong Kong.

As they both flew for Pan Am there was a short introduction about Pan Am's history and pictures of their time at Pan Am. Richard started out flying Boeing 707's and then Boeing 747's and made many landings and take-offs at Kai Tak.

Kai Tak only had one runway (referred to as 13 in one direction and 31 in the other,) and was on a landfill jutting out into Victoria harbour. The end of the runway attached to the land was close to a group of steep hills.

The airport was surrounded by 2000 ft. hills and the pilot had to make a sharp angled turn at a very low altitude to land. Videos of landings at Kai Tak show the approaching airplanes among the apartment buildings and this made for some spectacular pictures. A number of electronic and visual aids were provided to assist pilots in correctly timing this last-minute turn, the most well-known of which was a large checkerboard sign on a hilltop that marked the point to start the turn.

To quote Wikipedia, "Landings at the airport were dramatic to experience and technically demanding for pilots.[3] The History Channel program Most Extreme Airports ranked it as the 6th most dangerous airport in the world.[4]" General Meeting adjourned 8:45 pm
