Jeane Slone is the past Vice President and present board member of the California Redwood Writer's Club, a member of the Healdsburg Literary Guild, The Pacific Coast Air Museum, and The National Women's History Alliance. She has received the prestigious Jack London award.

Ms. Slone has published the historical novels, *She Flew Bombers*, finalist of the National 2012 Indie Book Award and *She Built Ships During WW II, She Was an American Spy During WW II,* and *She Was a WW II Photographer Behind Enemy Lines*, Indie Excellence Book Awards Finalist. Jeane Slone has produced an audio book of She Flew Bombers available on audible.com. She is

owner of ESL Publishing for English language learners.

Ms. Slone met and interviewed many of the WASPs. In 2009 she received a grant from the Sonoma County Arts Council to gather six WASPs to the Santa Rosa Vets Building. There was standing room only as the Santa Rosa Cmedia Lab filmed this historical event.

Jeane Slone's historical novels will be for sale at the end of the presentation.

Robin talked about planning for the upcoming Family Fun Day open house on Saturday September 21. Sonoma Skypark Assistant Manager Colin Traynor will contact the pilots and shareholders through email and the monthly newsletter to remind them of the rescheduled date.

Young Eagles will be this weekend. BK will not be there but Robin and Roland will coordinate with the regular volunteers handling registration, ground operations and flying.

EAA Airventure at Oshkosh and the Pietenpol fly-in the weekend before will be later this month. A number of Chapter 1268 members will attend one or both events. Chapter 1268 members can meet at Ron Price's campsite in Sally's Alley in the Vintage Camping area.

Darrel is cooking dinner tonight so isn't present at the Board meeting.

The speaker for the evening is Glenn Gathright of the FAA.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 6:30 pm.

Dinner was barbecued chicken and sausages, with corn salad, cabbage salad and cookies for dessert. A special treat were the delicious grilled lamb ribs brought by Bruce and Marcia Mc Glochlin.

Robin called the general meeting to order at 7:30.

Guests included Dr. John Schafer, local Aviation Medical Examiner.

The officers present repeated their reports for the members.

General discussion included planning for the rescheduled Sonoma Skypark Family Fun Day open house Saturday September 21 and Airventure at Oshkosh.

The mineral membership meeting was adjourned at 7:50 pm.

The speaker for the evening was Glenn Gathright, FAAST manager for the Oakland FAA FSDO. Glenn covered a broad range of subjects on the resources available for pilots and aircraft owners through the FAA and the local Flight Standards District Office.

EAA 1268 Board of Directors Meeting August 13, 2019

The Board Meeting was called to order by Vice President Darrel Jones at 6:30 pm. as President Robin Tatman was preparing dinner.

Present were: President Robin Tatman, Vice President Darrell Jones, Treasurer and Membership Chairman Bill Wheadon, Secretary Nelleke Cooper, Directors Roland Gangloff and Young Eagles Coordinator BK White.

Absent: Directors, Paul Siebert and Jeanette Woods

Darrel asked for an update on which board members were in possession of keys to the building after he had distributed them several months ago.

Treasurer report by Bill Wheadon: balance in checking account \$7,638.47, savings account \$103.69 and \$5,037.30 for a total of

\$12,779.46. This does not include the Jack Strehl fund.

Questions regarding the distribution of the scholarship to Fabiola Chavez and contribution by Tom Goodblood.

Young Eagles report for Sunday, August 11, by BK. White. We gave 26 Young Eagle rides with pilots being Don Booker in his Cherokee, Tim Goodblood in his light sport, Robin in her Cessna 120, new pilot to our group, Kevin Horn, in his RV and Darrel Jones in Jeanette Woods Cessna 172. BK mentioned that on average we fly about 20 kids each YE day, repeats and new, and this Sunday a new very appreciative mother and son. Ron Willits brought toys for all the Young Eagles. It was a clear and beautiful day. Details and names of ground crew helpers can be found in the August Newsletter.

Air Academy report by Darrel Jones. We have \$1,000 on deposit and we received \$60 worth of credits for their YE rides from the Gnoss Field Chapter. Our Chapter is securing 6 slots for next summer and still need \$140 to cover. Reserved slots are 4 slots for the Advanced Camp, ages 16-18, and 2 slots in Basic, ages 14-15, for which there are 2 different time sessions. At this time no slots for 12-13 years olds as it involves extra expenses charged by the airlines for flying as Unaccompanied Minors in the amount of \$600 per student. A discussion regarding a possible mini-camp here for the younger group.

Family Fund Day, on September 21 will need volunteers and the same jobs people signed up for will be on the schedule. Robin and Kathy are in charge, however, Kathy will not be in town the day off.

Will Campbell was present and it was the Premiere showing of the beautiful photos he took at this year's Air Venture, many of which will be used for official Oshkosh publications.

Congratulations to Ron Price, for the Award for his beautiful restored Luscombe-4 at Oshkosh.

Board Meeting adjourned 6:55 pm.

General Meeting called to order by Darrel at 7:50 pm. while Robin managed to save the evening by preparing dinner as our scheduled cook, Richard Craig, was called away due to the sudden passing of his father. Our condolences go out to Richard and his family.

Darrel thanked Robin for a delicious dinner of Tacos with all the trimmings. Beef, pork, chicken, salsa, guacamole, chips, rice, beans, tortillas and ice cream bars. Bill Wheadon, Nelleke and several other people helped.

Guests for the evening: Brent Mason, Gere Starks, Wayne Flower, old member and RC flyer, who recently purchased a Glasstar and Ken Short.

Robin introduced Marc Ashton, who informed the members of an upcoming ground school, being held at the Petaluma Community Center on Thursdays, from 7-9:00 pm. The program is a computer based Knowledge test and Marc will leave flyers. Information to be found at the Petaluma Training Center Website.

The officers gave their reports to the Members including YE, Treasurer report, Air Academy.

Roland Gangloff informed us he is in contact with our previous speaker Miles Geldard and it was National Elephant's Day yesterday.

Our speaker for the evening was Lew Jennings, who gave a fascinating account of his experiences flying Helicopters for the US Army during the Vietnam War. Lew is the author of "19 Minutes to Live."

Vietnam is a beautiful country with rice paddies, forests, mountains and in the monsoon

season areas that are one big lake. Lew explained that for that reason troops movement would be difficult and treacherous as there were no roads to speak of in Vietnam. Robert McNamara, the Secretary of Defense, decided helicopters would be the most efficient mode of operation in Vietnam. Lew had his Private Pilot's license at age 19 and when he was about to be drafted tried to join the Air Force and Navy as a pilot. Alas, he didn't have his 4 year degree yet, but the Army was very happy to enlist him to fly helicopters. Among other events, Lew talked about the infamous 11 day battle of Hamburger Hill, which against all odds the US Airborne group took causing heavy casualties to the People's Army of Vietnam and the US soldiers. Lew flew 726 helicopter combat missions in a Cobra Gunship and was awarded over 50 combat decorations, including three Distinguished Flying Crosses and 36 Air medals.

There were many questions for Lew and copies of Lew's book "19 Minutes to Live" were quite popular with the members.

General Meeting adjourned 9:30 pm.
