Membership Report – Welcome to 2020 and hopefully a year of good health, prosperity, and fun flying activities. Along with my good wishes comes the plea that comes this time of year for you to get current with your club dues – still only \$15. With your club dues we are able to stay in good standing with EAA National and also fund our chapter activities. This year our renewal with EAA National is \$583. With dues at \$15, it requires 39 member's renewals just to cover this expense. Also every year we, along with donors, help sponsor youths to attend the Air Academy at Oshkosh.

I think everyone knows by now that you can check renewal status by looking at your name badge color – blue if you're current, white if you're not. A membership form and address to send your dues check is on the back page of this newsletter or you can pick one up from one of the envelopes that's under the badge board in the clubhouse. Treasurer Report – We began 2019 with funds in our three accounts at Redwood Credit Union totaling \$10,000.96 and ended the year with a balance of \$13,179.05. These funds do not include money held in the Jack Strehl Memorial fund. Each year at the January Board of Directors meeting I present my Annual Report to the Board. My accounting is basically in the form of three documents. The primary ones being the "Running Balance Reports" which lists the incomes, expenses, and balances throughout the year for our Checking, Savings and CD accounts. The second document is the meal accounting. The third document are listings of bank deposits indicating source and amount of funds deposited.

Importance of; knowing your airplane well, fly your airplane only after a qualified mechanic agrees it's repaired, checking surrounding areas, and have a Safe Landing Plan in place.
