#### EAA CHAPTER 1268 MINUTES

February 11, 2020

EAA 1268 Board of Directors Meeting

The Board Meeting was called to order by President Robin Tatman at 6:25 pm.

Present were: President Robin Tatman, , Vice President Darrel Jones, Treasurer and Membership Chairman Bill Wheadon, Secretary Nelleke Cooper, Director Roland Gangloff, Jeanette Woods and Young Eagles Coordinator B.K. White

Absent: Director Paul Siebert

Darrel announced plans to arrange a work party for Saturday, Feb.15 to update the Clubhouse and ask for volunteers at the General Meeting. A membership drive needs to be organized and contacts made by phone and invitations send to local pilots in our geographical area to increase our Membership. In addition, once our Flying Club is up and running active pilots could be recruited.

Darrel spoke with Travis Morton, who ran the flight school in the past and had recently researched weather stations. There were 2 possibilities with Internet connected weather stations; however, one was better than the other, for approximately \$1000.

Air Academy: Darrel has received one application from Evan Buckley, an 18 year old student from Petaluma, who has passed the written FAA test and has taken flight lessons. Robin mentioned Kyra Hernandez, a High School Jr. from Santa Rosa, who might apply. It is her intention to first get her private pilot license.

We still need a volunteer to prepare dinner for the August meeting. Marcus Shackford has agreed to be the speaker for one of our meetings, and Yayoi West will speak in March, which leaves 3 meetings to be determined.

Roland Gangloff noted that we often didn't have ice for our drinks and volunteered to be in charge of bringing ice and gloves for our food preparers to our meetings.

#### Board Meeting adjourned 6:58 pm

General Meeting called to order by President Robin Tatman at 7:35 pm.

She thanked Bill Wheadon and his sous-chef. Jan, for a delicious meal of his special Chili recipe, salad, French bread, corn bread, with ice cream and toppings for dessert. Guest Ron Young, friend of our speaker was introduced. He is a sailor who had participated in 7 America Cups. He joked about sailing being "An obsolete form of transportation!" Ernie Flower spoke about the changes in requirements for Remote Control Model Planes. The FAA has dedicated certain fields which are currently legal, but if they lose that status they can never be re-registered. He asked for support and comments on the FAA website to fight for Model Airplanes. Darrel remarked to check out the electronic version of the Newsletter for further information.

B.K. White reported that due to the high winds there was no Young Eagles flying the Sunday before.

Bill Wheadon showed us an artistic rendering of himself and his airplane made by one of his Young Eagles riders, who had flown with him 3 or 4 times. Every detail of the airplane was perfect, but Bill wasn't so sure about the rendition of himself!

Bill also mentioned he contested a \$10 "withdrawal currency fee" the Bank had charged. The charge is for cash deposits greater than \$1000. Since we did not make a cash deposit anywhere near that amount, the assessment was invalid and was withdrawn.

The Youth Protection training and form has been completed by Roland Gangloff. Two other leaders of the Air Explorers completed it as well.

Darrel asked for volunteers for the work party he had planned for Saturday, February 15, starting at 9:00 am. Projects to be taken care of include moving the new movie screen and projector, get the computer set up for the flight simulator, installing LED lights, which will need new wiring, and sheetrock part of the wall.

Robin mentioned the need for help with a Membership drive.

Darrel updated the Membership on his findings about the Weather Station.

Gene Marcinkowski volunteered to cook dinner in August with help from his son-in-law Andy Smith.

Roland spoke about organizing a group to go to the Reno Air Races.

Ron Price mentioned there would be a Reunion of the American Aviation Historical Organization at the Hiller Museum in San Carlos on April 24 and 25.

Robin presented the Board Members with 2019 Chapter Service Awards. Darrel Jones received Awards for Vice President, Newsletter Editor/Publisher and Web Editor, which he remarked should go to Gretchen McDougall, Bill Wheadon for Treasurer and Membership Chair, Nelleke for Secretary and Robin for being the President. The Chapter received the Bronze Chapter Award in the form of a beautiful Poster to be displayed on our Clubhouse wall.

Will Campbell's photographs of Family Fun Day will be posted on our website.

Wayne Schake introduced the speaker for the evening his friend Bruce Janigian, who according to Wayne had 3 strikes against him. One, he was not a pilot, two, he was a Navy Captain (the typical fun rivalry as Wayne was in the Air Force) and three, he was a lawyer. Bruce's presentation gave insight in the life of Jimmy Doolittle and the Doolittle Raid on Tokyo during WWII.

While in the Navy Bruce's Commander asked him to teach a class on Combat Leadership at the Naval Academy. Bruce replied that he did not have Combat experience, but his Commander insisted. This assignment prompted Bruce to study heroes from past wars and one of them, not well-known to the general public was James "Jimmy" Doolittle. Doolittle was one of the great aviation pioneers of the 1920-1930's and the first to obtain his doctorate in aeronautical engineering from MIT. Doolittle's calculated planning and modifications made to the twin-engine 2 tails B-25 Bombers, to be able to take off from the aircraft carrier the Hornet, made the raid successful even though there were many setbacks.

They had to launch earlier and further away from Japan because they had been discovered by a Japanese Navy picket boat that had sent out an alarm to Japan. Doolittle and Hornet skipper Captain Marc Mitscher decided to launch the B-25s immediately—10 hours early and 650 nautical miles from Japan which was 170 nautical miles farther from Japan than planned. 15 out of the 16 B-25's successfully delivered their ordinance scattered over a wide area not only hitting Tokyo, but steelworks, oil refineries and even an aircraft carrier. They accomplished their goal and struck at the heart of Japan.

Jimmy Doolittle saw many changes in aviation during his lifetime. He passed away in 1993 at the age of 96.
