NATHAN WILSON FLYING IN FRANCE

I received this from Nathan Wilson, our Ray Scholar who earned his private pilot's license this last year. He is studying in college in Belgium.

The past summer I was lucky enough to go to the south of France to see some family, and while I was there, I took advantage of an opportunity to fly an ultralight aircraft.

My grandfather has a good friend who owns a plot of land in the rolling hills of Provence. He proposed to take me flying for a day. My mom and I drove over to his house, and he showed me the aircraft. He had it stored in a barn and towed it out with a lawnmower. There was no concrete, the entire plot was grass and dirt.

Once it was out of the hangar, we got in the plexiglass cockpit. There were bucket seats, sticks, a glass cockpit, and that was it. A very light plane with barely any accessories in it. He fired it up and we taxied 20 feet to his runway. A large strip of dirt and grass with cones on the side, all going downhill.



The takeoff was easy as the aircraft was so light. He then let me take the controls as soon as we were in the air. I flew over landmarks I knew from childhood, certain lakes roads, and houses. It was a lot of fun to see a new view from the sky as well as fly in a different country.

He told me to fly back to his strip after a while, and I couldn't find it. He assumed the controls at one point and the next thing I knew we were headed straight for a mountain. After looking around for a bit I realized where the strip was and we were headed straight for the ground.

He pulled up at the end for the smoothest landing you can get on that uphill dirt strip. We taxied back and it was an incredible flight overall. I had a lot of fun and can't wait to get my European private pilot's license conversion so I can fly solo in Europe.

HERE IS REMEMBRANCE FROM LESLEY ABOUT HER DAD JOHN MILES.

John Kenneth Miles aka Grumpy July 27, 1926 - December 25, 2020

I heard him leave. It was like someone had tossed a small rock against the side of the

house. Not a pebble and definitely not a boulder but a crack, a thud.

That was earlier than the phone call at 1:35 am from hospice. The kind voiced nurse said, "Mr. John Miles passed yesterday, Christmas night at 11:57."

I had tried to close my eyes to sleep, my watch vigilantly recorded my heart rate 95, 91, 88 the low. It was not a night of peaceful rest, downstairs the birds nest fern had flown from the table and crashed to the floor.

And....

I knew the transition was afoot.

Covid-19 took him. Initially he wasn't ready, but that didn't mean he didn't become ready. His last heard words by family, "Oh s**t." The littlest one had shared, specifically warned not to, "Grumpy, I am so sorry you are going to die." Apparently, a surprise, his reaction was hard not to understand. But perhaps it gave him time to prepare. That was two days ago.

Such a long life of curiosity; of people, dogs, cats, birds, plants, airplanes and friends. His smile included you and leveled the playing field, we are equal.

Several years ago, at Christmas I'd asked him to teach us about music. A violin prodigy, he played a solo with the San Francisco philharmonic orchestra at 12, he shared with us his love of music. The iPad lesson started with the drum and then the flute, the pipes of Ireland, evolving prehistory. The beginnings of music through the ages, and then the evolution of his life experience of music unfolded. His favorite song ended our lesson, Imagine by John Lennon.

Music continually played in the background of his expansive life; flying his antique Taylor craft, driving Blanco, the 64 Chevy Impala convertible, hiking, traveling everywhere alone so that he could experience life and connection on his own terms. He never met a woman he wouldn't flirt with nor a dog he wouldn't pet.



In his late '70's he got Lasik surgery in preparation for a month-long trip down the Colorado River at high water in March. Not for the faint hearted, he was worried he would lose his glasses and not be able to see the crests and valleys of the class 10 rapids. His dream to fly in the navy was curtailed by the damn glasses but eventually at 50 he became a pilot. Picking of course a taildragger, he flew across the country multiple times and then to Alaska above miles and miles of uncharted territory in his 80's. Everywhere he went he made a friend and shared a joke..." Did you hear about the fire at the circus? It was intense!"

As a parent his adventurous spirit provided complexity. We shared joy in nature, stories, and ultimately simple visits the last 9 months separated by glass as we could not touch and pantomimed and tried to hear.

He was truly present as he shared time and that ball of the foot bouncing energy with grandchildren and the greats too. Loving teaching about everything from poetry to astronomy, his boundless interest in the world was at its best when shared with children.

It is raining as they move his body to the coroner, Covid-19 has specific protocols that leave us lacking. I know that a drop of rain will land on his outstretched hand and he will look at it with wonder and joy, how beautiful, how ironic and how sad, tears fall, remember...

You may say I'm a dreamer But I am not the only one I hope someday you'll join us And the world will be as one...

We all know better than to fly directly over the homes south/southeast of the airport, but it still happens and the County still gets complaints (sometimes multiple) when it does. Many times, a little research on our part shows that their complaint might actually be justified.

GFCA occasionally gets noise complaints, too, and while we always direct them to Dan Jensen, we also note that we (the flying community) understand their frustrations and go out of our way to educate our local pilots of the established standard pattern which avoids such overflights.

We've talked about this a lot, but we have a couple of local pilots who take the attitude "they shouldn't have bought a house close to an airport". GFCA isn't going to step in and become the "enforcer", but we will try to contact individuals in obvious cases. It's incumbent upon each of us to speak up when we witness something we know is wrong. Our neighbors are smart, and it's only a matter of time before they learn how to track down registered owners. In fact, it's already been done.

If you fly over there, be courteous.
