Ron started the remembrance with a heart-felt and deeply emotional recounting of meeting Paul at Fremont Airport and developing a lifelong friendship that eventually brought Paul and Marilyn to Sonoma Skypark.

Paul's and Marilyn's children and family added their memories and feelings of love and respect for Paul to an appreciative crowd of Paul's many friends in attendance.

The memorial was concluded with a missing man formation fly-over, led by Tom palmer in his cub, Bob Berwick in the Travel Air, me in the 182 and Ron flying the Vagabond for the missing man position.

Marilyn shared the following eulogy with me for the newsletter:

Paul was always interested in planes. His joy came from being involved with old planes, motorcycles, and cars...in restoring, rescuing, piloting. He was known for his careful restorations, gathering original information and instruction and intuiting the intent of the original engineer.

He was an engineer himself, attending Parks Air College in St. Louis, MO. He worked as an engineer for several companies centered around aviation. He was a teacher, a husband, a father, and philosopher. He turned to spirituality, Rudolf Steiner, Eckhart Tolle, Deepak Chopra and others as years went by.

After his divorce he moved from Cleveland to Savannah, GA and then to California where he met Marilyn. He found his Fleet biplane in a barn, joined the Schellville Escadrille & Sonoma Skypark and they moved to Sonoma.

He enjoyed the fly-ins and gatherings in the Midwest with his friends, always gathering information, insights, and new friends.

He will be missed by his wife Marilyn, sister Joanie, daughters Christine & Lorri, stepchildren Lisa, Joel and wife May, grandsons Christopher, Jacob, and Jackson, and many friends.

Board of Directors Meeting September 14, 2021

The October meeting was discussed and the board decided to make it an in-person meeting with masks indoors except when eating. RG suggested the meeting could be held with the doors open and fans circulating air.

Young Eagles was discussed and it was decided to have a Young Eagles Rally Sunday October 10, with participants masked while in airplanes and not socially distancing outdoors. RG suggested having masks available for those who didn't bring their own.

DJ reported that he will contact EAA to have insurance coverage for the Saturday barbecues since they are benefiting Chapter 1268's scholarship program.

RG is researching post-graduate scholarships through Teen Services for a young woman from Boyes Springs who has an interest in an aviation career.

RT reported that A&P schools are now advertising on TV for students for aviation industry training. She volunteered to talk to Teen Services about aviation mechanics careers.

DJ reported that the Chapter's Ray Aviation scholars still need to get their student pilot certificates.

BW reported that the Chapter CD was renewed at 0.614%.

DJ stated that membership recruitment is now a priority as COVID restrictions are loosened in order to rebuild Chapter activity.

The Board meeting was adjourned at 6:40.

The general membership meeting was called to order by RT at 7:00 pm.

Officers and Board members gave their reports to the members present on Zoom.
