Our speaker will be Bob and Marilyn Avrit's son, Lt Col Jim Avrit, USAF, (Ret).

Jim is a Command Navigator with over 2000 hours in the F-4D/E/F/G. He served as an F-4G Wild Weasel Electronic Warfare Officer (back seater) with the 561st Tactical Fighter Squadron which deployed to Bahrain in support of Operation Desert Shield/Operation Desert Storm flying 33 combat sorties beginning with the mission into Baghdad on the first night. The primary mission of the Wild Weasel is the Suppression of Enemy Air Defenses (SEAD) through the destruction of radars used to guide enemy surface to air missiles (SAMs) and anti-aircraft artillery (AAA).

He was also an instructor and evaluator with the 9th Fighter Squadron training German Air Force students initial F-4 mission training. During his time as an F-4 crew member he flew throughout the US, Europe and the Middle East, logged multiple ocean crossings and participated in numerous large force and live weapon exercise such as Red Flag, Combat Hammer, and Mission Employment phase for the USAF Fighter Weapons School.

In his non-flying AF assignments, he served at HQ Air Combat Command (ACC) in the SEAD requirements branch which is responsible for the modernization of all ACC SEAD aircraft.

sensors and weapon systems. He was assigned a tour at HQ FAA in Washington DC as a DoD liaison to manage the joint use of the RF spectrum to support DoD training, testing and operations.

He also worked for the Secretary of the Air Force International Affairs as a Disclosure Officer providing technical and operational expertise for the transfer and licensing aspects of exporting fighter aircraft, sensors, and munitions through Foreign Military Sales and Direct Commercial Sales programs.

RAY SCHOLAR

I asked our Ray Scholar, Sebastian Johnson, for a report on his flight training progress. His report follows:

Over the course of the last couple of months, I have picked up my flight training to upwards of three times a week. With the closing of the competitive gymnastics season, I have elected to take a day or two off every week to go fly.

After several months of not being able to fly, I am slowly beginning to feel comfortable in an aircraft again. With the first couple of flights being the simple ground reference maneuvers, we have now moved to solely focusing on landings, as those seem to be my weak point.

Not normal landings, per se, but specifically soft field landings. Something in my head sees it as a completely different landing and I always seem to pull the power a little too quick, and then correct that immediately with an unnecessary amount of extra thrust. After about 800 feet of runway space lost, we finally get down on the runway and after cursing myself out, we taxi off and clean up.

Over the summer, I will be dedicating upwards of 4 days a week to fly and focus on obtaining my PPL. Once I get out of school this week, I will be able to adapt my schedule more around flying to ensure I am able to solo sooner in the summer.

Along with actually flying, Darrel and I have been meeting once weekly to discuss my written test, which should be able to be achieved at some point within the month. I am incredibly grateful to Darrel and the other tutors for all of the time and care they have put into tutoring me. Thank you for all of the incredible support!

Along with that, as for the FAA practice tests, it's largely still weather issues and I will continue to work on those.

EAA CHAPTER 1268 MINUTES

May 10, 2022

The Board meeting was called to order at 6:09 pm on May 10th, 2022 at Harry F. West Jr. Memorial Clubhouse

Present were VP Darrel Jones (DJ), Treasurer Bill Wheadon (BW), Secretary Yayoi West joined by zoom (YW), Board member Roland Gangloff (RG). President Robin Tatman (RT) was in the clubhouse, but unable to join this meeting because she was preparing dinner for the evening.

BW Our savings account at redwood credit union earned \$78.31 interest last year. This is the month to file IRS 990-N, and it was filed. Two of Air Academy cadets' tickets to Oshkosh were \$3,974.74. One of them was charged an additional \$300 because they were under 15years old and unaccompanied by an adult.

DJ We are still tutoring Ray Scholarship recipient Sebastian Johnson to prepare him for his written exam.

DJ Robin's report. Since she was elected to President of Sonoma Skypark Airport Board of Directors, and she will be stepping down as president of EAA Chapter 1268 but she will remain as a board member. We need to find someone else to serve as president for our chapter.

DJ We need volunteers to supply dinner for the August, September and November meetings. RG will do the October dinner.

The Board meeting was adjourned at 6:44 pm.

There was no speaker for the meeting, so members socialized during and after dinner. Robin and the officers gave their reports to the membership after dinner.

Scholarship Chairman Roland Gangloff has been working on materials to clarify the roles and responsibilities of Chapter 1268 flight training scholarship applicants and recipients. The following is his draft document. Contact Roland with any feedback and suggestions you have.

WHAT CHAPTER 1268 EXPECTS OF ALL SCHOLARSHIP AWARDEES

All awardees are expected to take their commitment to fulfill all stated scholarship requirements very seriously. Ray Scholars are especially cautioned to stay on track to earn their pilot certificate and reach flight training milestones, as outlined by EAA's training timeline.

All awardees are expected to put the scholarship time requirements ahead of other time demands such as:

- A. Sports
- B. All extracurricular school social activities.
- C. All other social activities

All awardees are expected to give two hours of service per month as volunteers in chapter activities such:

• Young Eagles activities

- Hamburger Saturdays
- Fly-ins
- Chapter build project support.
- Chapter meeting dinners and preparation

Submit regular progress reports, signed off by local chapter and CFI.

Chapter 1258 will play a critical role in helping all awardees to stay on track to meet the requirements of their particular scholarship. The chapter will do so through tutoring and providing access to flight simulators and Sporty's Learn to Fly Course in the case of flight training scholarships such as the Ray Aviation Scholarship.

Roland also put together this draft guide for Young Eagles and their parents outlining the EAA requirements for Young Eagles pilots.

Requirements for Pilots Flying Young Eagles

Introduction: National EAA requires that pilots and their aircraft meet important safety standards with the wellbeing of your child in mind.

The Young Eagles pilot requirements are basic, but MUST be followed.

- Be a current EAA® member and hold an appropriate airman's certificate (sport pilot or greater).
- Possess a current medical certificate (if applicable as per FAA regs.)
- Be current to carry passengers in the aircraft you plan to use (as per FAA regs.)
- Have a current flight review.
- Complete the Young Eagles registration form before the flight, including parent or legal guardian signature, and pilot signature.
- Conduct flights in an aircraft that is in airworthy condition (as per FAA regulations.)
- Have aircraft passenger liability insurance for the aircraft used (owned, rented, or borrowed) with \$100,000 per seat coverage.
- EAA Chapter Liability Insurance (Personal Injury-\$1,000,000)
- Adhere to all applicable Federal Air Regulations (FARs).
- Complete both the online training and basic background check as a part of EAA's Youth Protection Policy. For more information visit **EAA.org/YouthProtection.**
