Treasurer Report - For the month of June we had one deposit in our checking account of \$961 and two disbursements totaling \$295.31. The deposit consisted of \$295 in dinner receipts from our June meeting (countered by a check as reimbursement to our dinner cook for \$145.31). There was another check written for \$150 to pay for a repair to our grill. Also included in the deposit was \$90 in dues renewal and \$576 in proceeds from our Saturday BBQs in June.

The Board meeting was called to order at 6:11pm on June 14th, 2022 at Harry F. West Jr. Memorial Clubhouse

Present were VP Darrel Jones (DJ), Treasurer Bill Wheadon (BW), Secretary Yayoi West (YW), Board members Roland Gangloff (RG) and Robin Tatman (RT)

DJ reported that on Sunday, June 12, Chapter 1268 flew 12 Young Eagles and 3 adult Eagles with two pilots.

DJ will make an online schedule for Saturday BBQ volunteers and email the link to the members.

BW will send an email to the members asking for volunteers.

DJ will check with EAA about insurance covering the Saturday barbecues and will ask if the insurance covers non-EAA member volunteers.

RT If we let EAA know ahead of time, we can fly Young Eagles at any time.

DJ is continuing tutoring with Ray scholar Sebastian Johnson. Our goal is for him to take the private pilot written exam by the end of June. He needs to continue taking practice exams. Sporty will endorse him for his written exam.

BW asked when he can expect to get an invoice from Petaluma Training Center for Sebastian's flight training. RT will ask Marc Ashton. DJ reported that we are trying to schedule a meeting with Ray scholar Philip Lachman and his father to resolve the suspended flight training.

DJ reported that there are ten people interested in joining the Sonoma Skypark Flying Club being organized at the airport.

RT There is a great gathering for Ray Scholars at Yolo Airport on June 18th, It is the NorCal Regional Ray Scholars Gathering.

RT reported the good news that Chapter 1268 received Gold Chapter status and banner from EAA.

The Board meeting was adjourned at 6:49 pm.

Ernie Ganas prepared a delicious dinner of barbecued tri-tip steak, salad, garlic bread and ice cream.

The speaker was Lt. Col Jim Avrit, Ret., who talked about his experiences flying F-4 Phantom fighters as a Wild Weasel in Operation Desert Shield in Iraq.

WOMEN ON MOTORCYCLES



Today in Mighty Girl history, two young women set off on an incredible journey in 1916 -- sisters Augusta and Adeline Van Buren began the first successful transcontinental motorcycle tour across the U.S. by two women on solo motorcycles. They rode 5,500 miles in 60 days often over unpaved roads while traveling from NYC to Tijuana, Mexico.

The imminent entrance of the U.S. into WWI inspired the sisters' feat as they sought to prove that women could ride as well as men and were capable of serving as military dispatch riders. The women dressed in military-style leggings and leather riding breeches which were taboo at that time for women and, as a result, they were arrested several times along the way for wearing men's clothing. Yet, these two inspirational trailblazers were undaunted. As Augusta famously once stated, "Woman can if she will."

Following their historic journey, both women continued to be trailblazers -- Adeline went on to earn a law degree at New York University while Augusta became a pilot and joined Amelia Earhart's international women's flying organization the Ninety-Nines. Augusta also became active in the women's rights movement fighting to win women the right to vote.
