Hello all!

Last month I wrote of the rapidly approaching private pilot knowledge test. I am happy to inform everyone (that didn't hear at least) that I have since taken the test, and passed with a 92%. Since then, I have completed several cross countries, including one to Little River, one to Tracy and Davis, and most recently my first solo cross country to Colusa, in the north central valley.

On the first day of October, I will be doing another solo cross country to Lincoln regional, carefully planning it out in order to not accidentally do some formation flying with the fighters up in Beale (at the request of my CFI).

This month, the deadline month for the scholarship, I will be dedicating my time fully to completing my solo cross countries and my instrument time. After that, it's mock check rides and then the hunt for a DPE.

As for volunteering, while the next couple of Saturdays I will be flying, I look forward to seeing you all at the weekly BBQs! While this may be the final month of the scholarship, I cannot feel anything but grateful towards the Skypark community and the support I have received. I look forward to every Saturday that I can go and volunteer in the club house and meet all of the wonderful pilots here in Sonoma. You'll be seeing me plenty postscholarship.

Adding on to that, I am just about 70 hours, with the only things I'm in need of is an extra 2 hours of instrument time and a little more solo time to look good for the DPE (plus a long cross country).
