# Report from Aircraft Building Team,

As of last week, we have finished gluing the port side fuselage, and I would imagine the starboard side will be done shortly.

I have a question and request to the chapter. Do we have any storage possibility for chairs, ice chests or any other items that currently stored at the Building Shop that could be moved? (Yes, they can. Ed.)

It is hard to moving around because the entry door won't open fully, and Power-tool tables are placed very tight to the assembly table. For safety and our efficient movement, I would like to move all the power tools to the west side of the shop where the power outlets are located.

Currently, an extension cord is going thru the side of assembly table and people are walking over it all the time. I am afraid someone might trip over near the power tool table. If we can remove chairs and other items not immediately needed to somewhere else, we can set up all the power-tool tables near the power outlet and it would be safer.

# **EAA CHAPTER 1268 MINUTES**

May 2023

The Board meeting was called to order at 6:21pm on May,9th, 2023 at Harry F. West Jr. Memorial Clubhouse
Present were Donald Booker (DB), Bill
Wheadon (BW), Darrel Jones (DJ), Yayoi West
(YW), Marci Allard (MA), Nelleke Cooper
(NC) by zoom.

DJ reported that Chapter 1268 is now current with our 199N annual tax return filings to the Franchise Tax Board. The Chapter now has an online account. He also reported that Chapter 1268 has to register and file with the California Attorney General's office. He filed the necessary documents and forms required.

BW reported that the IRS 990N annual tax return is filed.

YW report from the Pietenpol Building Team. We have cut pieces and are ready to assembly fuselage sides. Yayoi asked if it would be acceptable if one of our young members wished to fundraise for his own trip to Oshkosh by using clubhouse. After discussing the idea, it was decided that such a fundraiser wouldn't fall under the Chapter's non-profit status.

DJ discussed fundraising responsibilities. He is the chairperson for raising funds for the kitchen and restroom upgrades and Yayoi is the chairperson for fundraising for the Pietenpol Chapter building project. DB proposed selling items donated to the club at the Saturday burger barbecues and club meetings. He will clear a table in the clubhouse to display donated items for sale. After discussing idea, the Board agreed that would be a good idea and encouraged Don to implement the sale of donated items. He will donate a Sporty's radio and Garmin 295 for sale, as well as miscellaneous manuals, books and charts. DJ will list items in a for sale section of the monthly newsletter.

BW pointed out that we don't have first-aid kit in the kitchen. Tim Bloodgood donated and installed one upon hearing of the need. We will need another one for the shop.

BW reported that anonymous donors gave \$500 toward the new kitchen stove purchase.

DJ reported that David Kindle volunteered to organize the tools donated for the shop. DJ will meet with him and make an inventory and start a Chapter tool crib so Chapter members can check out tools for their projects. EAA national has software for organizing a tool crib.

DB observed that need more people coming to meetings. The board discussed the membership drive and the need to send an email blast through the national EAA office to recruit new members.

MA suggested inviting the high school mechanic and machine tool classes to the clubhouse for a workshop on aviation mechanics. She will contact the high school to explore that possibility

The Board meeting was adjourned at 6:59pm. Sindy Mikkelsen provided dinner again with three main courses, pulled pork, French dip and ham and Swiss, with pasta salad, grapes in yogurt and pies for dessert.

The speaker was Art Hayden, who talked about mountain flying and flying in South Africa and Alaska.
