EAA 1268 MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN AND TREASURER REPORT July 2023

Activity in the treasury department of EAA 1268 was subdued in June. We had two dues renewals totaling \$30 and three fundraising activities that brought in \$181. Expenses for our monthly dinner slightly exceeded proceeds (by \$6) - the key to making our dinners consistently profitable is to increase turnout.

Other income included a check from EAA in the amount of \$1650 to be used by one of our Ray Scholars for his flight training. We also received interest income in our savings and cd accounts totaling \$18 for the month.

We had four pilots flying today, with George Bachich flying his Cub, Paul Hollingsworth coming over from Petaluma in his very popular gyrocopter, Bill Banner, Gardner Bride's nephew, bringing his 182, and my 182. Altogether we flew 25 Young Eagles and seven adult Eagles.

They are ready to asssemble the sides, top and bottom of the fuselage, which will be exciting to see it taking shape. After the seats and floor are in, the team members can ppose for a photo sitting in the completed fuselage.

We will need to pick up a couple more sheets of plywood, but the project has mosst of the materials otherwise. We are still looking for donations to offset the estimated \$7,000 additional costs of completing the airplane. If anyone has a good small Contenental engine they would be willing to donate, it would save having to build up a new engine.

EAA CHAPTER 1268 MINUTES June 13, 2023

EAA 1268 Board of Directors Meeting

The Board Meeting was called to order by President Don Booker at 6:15 pm. Darrel Jones set up the Zoom meeting.

Present: President Don Booker, Vice President Darrel Jones, Treasurer Bill Wheadon, Directors, Robin Tatman, Roland Gangloff, Nelleke Cooper and Marsi Allard Absent: Secretary Yayoi West

Darrel reported that Sebastian Johnson had successfully passed his Private Pilot check ride. Sebastian is a talented gymnast who, someday, may be competing in the Olympics.

Kate Llodra soloed and Luis Membrila passed his written test. Another prospective scholarship recipient, Hayden Holbrook, is motivated to become and airline pilot and has been helping with activities at Skypark, including Saturday BBQ's, Christmas party etc.

Roland and Michael Wray have been working with Teen Services to foster interest in aviation and introduce them to Skypark airport. Roland and Michael participated in a meeting at the newly created career center at the Sonoma Valley High School.

Robin also believes in the value for young people to get a Private Pilot license whether they want aviation as a career or not as it would open up other doors and opportunities and help them with future endeavors.

Young Eagles report is in the June Newsletter. 3 pilots flew 17 Young Eagles. (Luis was the first one to fly in the gyrocopter.) Darrel mentioned that we have an influx of young people at the airport. He suggested sending out a request to pilots in our area to start a fund to help aspiring young pilots. With the Flying Club already established this could be quite successful.

In order to increase our Membership, Roland and George Bachich made phone calls to previous years members from lists provided by Bill. Darrel sent out the Newsletter to all shareholders.

Robin suggested having sign-up sheets to recruit members for our Chapter at the Young Eagles meetings as many parents have shown interest in participating.

Marc Ashton discussed the seriousness expected for recipients of scholarships. Today's young people are involved in multiple activities and are often overwhelmed. Their Petaluma flight school has a rule that parents of students under 18 and/or are college bound are required to attend periodic meetings to understand the commitment needed to be successful to obtain a Private Pilot's License. Marc mentioned the FAA changed the rules and made it much more difficult. Often the oral exam is now 4 hours and the flight portion of the exam 2 hours.

In addition to being the Membership chair, Roland has agreed to be the Speaker Coordinator.

It was brought up that people don't know where Skypark is and confuse it with Schellville airport. Prominent signage will be needed pointing toward Skypark and there should be signs at Skypark itself pointing to the location of the Clubhouse.

Board Meeting adjourned 7:00 pm

Membership meeting called to order by President Don Booker at 7:45 pm

David Kendall mentioned that the flight simulator is up and running and he will buy the software for it.

Marsi Allard, with help from Legia Booker, provided an exquisite dinner of salmon with a special sauce, rice, broccoli and cake with a mixed berry sauce and whipped cream.

Marsi Allard and Marilyn Siebert are cosharing the responsibility for the Saturday BBQ"s.

The inventory of tools in the Pietenpol hangar will be available for members to use. The EAA shop still needs some cleaning out.

Bill Wheadon reported the treasurer report is in the newsletter.

Darrel gave a report on the Young Eagles as discussed in the Board meeting. Marc Ashton mentioned events at the Petaluma airport: Petaluma EAA meets 2nd Wednesdays of the month; Display Day next Saturday; the Two-Niner Diner restaurant will re-open by the end July; two flight training scholarships will be available next year.

Marc also reported that there has been heavy mixed traffic at Petaluma which has caused problems as faster corporate aircraft often do a direct approach cutting off slower traffic.

George Bachich gave a fascinating report on flying his Pitts in an abbreviated spin recovery procedure which almost killed him. His advice was to make sure you always follow the procedure process.

WOMEN IN AIRPLANES

Join us in remembering Stefania Cecylia Wojtulanis-Karpińska, born on this day in 1912. In January 1, 1941 Stefania was appointed as the first foreigner (along with Anna Leska) to the British ATA (Air Transport Auxiliary), which provided airplanes from factories to the airports of individual units and damaged machines to repair factories or scrap yards. Flights were carried out without radio communication, navigation maps, often in bad weather, and it also required learning about the piloting of various types of aircraft supplied, including twin-engine bombers like Vickers Wellington.

She was married to a pilot, colonel Stanisław Karpiński.
