EAA 1268 TREASURERS REPORT August 2023

One bank deposit was made in July totaling \$761. Included in the deposit was \$700 in receipts from the Saturday BBQ in parts of June and July, \$15 in a dues renewal, and \$46 in receipts from our July dinner. We did receive \$15.69 in interest income on our CD account.

Expenses totaling \$1174.56 were attributed to: \$232.39 for reimbursement for supplies purchased for the Pietenpol chapter project, \$157.27 for additional checks, and \$785.90 for air travel for one of our Air Academy attendees.

Total chapter funds are \$42,097.66 distributed in the following accounts:

EAA CHAPTER 1268 MINUTES

July 11, 2023

EAA 1268 Board of Directors Meeting

The Board Meeting was called to order by President Don Booker at 6:05 pm. Darrel Jones set up the Zoom meeting.

Present: President Don Booker, Vice President Darrell Jones, Treasurer Bill Wheadon, Directors Roland Gangloff and Nelleke Cooper Present on Zoom: Yayoi West

Roland will check with Staples to get information on prices and designs of the proposed signs needed at Skypark as discussed at the previous month meeting. He will email pictures of the signs with the suggested wording to all Board Members prior to have them printed. 4 Signs will be needed and will be especially helpful on Young Eagles Sundays.

Roland and Michael Wray have been working with Teen Services and are planning to bring a group to Steve Silver's, a United Captain, hangar next Friday. The emphasis is the exposure of the group to careers in aviation. There are also plans to visit the North Coast aviation Museum in Santa Rosa.

Our scholarship recipients, Kate Llodra and Luis Membrila-Martinez are preparing for their Private Pilot checkride in August. They both are in the process of completing the required Cross-country flights.

As previous mentioned our Treasurer Bill Wheadon will retire and a new Treasurer will be needed. It is mentioned that we need to get younger people involved.

Rony Kurniawan, father of James, a regular participant in the Young Eagles program, has stepped up and has been helpful at many Chapter functions, including Saturday BBQ's, EAA meetings etc.

Yayoi mentioned more plywood was needed for the Pietenpol project and Darrel ordered Tshirts for the participants.

Richard Craig is in the process of adding on to his hangar.

Board Meeting adjourned 6:55 pm

Membership Meeting called to order at 7:20 pm by President Don Booker.

He thanked Darrel Jones for the delicious dinner of Barbequed Chicken and Sausage, green salad, potato salad and Snicker Doodle Cookies made by Catherine.

Don welcomed the guests for the evening Tom Weaver, Anan and Antoine Bigirinana.

Darrel gave a report on the Young Eagles Flights of last Sunday. The pilots flew 33 flights total, 25 Young Eagles and 7 adults.

Darrel explained the mission of the Young Eagles program to interest young people in aviation careers and Roland explained that he was in the process of trying to recruit from the Teen Services program.

Darrel introduced our scholarship recipients, Luis and Kate, to the members and they explained their experiences of their successful Cross-Country flights. When the students complete a milestone in the Ray Scholarship program, they receive a LightSpeed headset, which both Kate and Luis have received and Kate demonstrated. Darrel also explained our scholarships and that our organization has been able to provide \$11,000 for scholarships for each of the students.

Funds for our scholarship are raised by the proceeds from the Saturday BBQ's, donations and Ray scholarships.

Luis reported that he had to convert his planned landing at Little River airport due to fog and landed at Ukiah instead. Kate has completed 2 of her long cross-country flights and gave Darrel lots of credit for supporting her. Both of them were introduced to flight participating in our Young Eagles program. Bill Wheadon asked them if they were allowed a GPS on their flights, which they were, but theirs were antiquated and they ended up doing it without their GPS.

Wayne Schake introduced the speaker for the evening, local attorney, Bruce Janigian. Bruce is a retired Navy Captain, Adjunct Professor at the University of the Pacific and Golden Gate University and Scholar at Stanford's Hoover Institute of War, Revolution and Peace.

The subject of his presentation was from "Crimea to Crimea" the connection between the war in Ukraine and the History of Crimea. It was a fascinating report on the complicated history of the relations between Great Britain, Russia and China.

WOMEN IN AIRPLANES


Tammie Jo Shults is an American retired commercial airline captain, author, and former naval aviator. Known for being one of the first female fighter pilots to serve in the United States Navy, following active duty she became a pilot for Southwest Airlines, retiring in 2020. While in the U.S. Navy, she served as an instructor pilot flying the F/A-18 Hornet and EA-6B Prowler, achieving the rank of lieutenant commander.

On April 17, 2018, Shults successfully landed a Southwest Boeing 737 after an engine exploded at high altitude, causing multiple system failures and a rapid depressurization. Her successful landing of Flight 1380 at Philadelphia International Airport saved 148 lives including passengers and crewmembers. Since her retirement,



Shults continues to fly privately, serves as a volunteer pilot, and along with her husband, serves as board members for the nonprofit organization, Angel Flight South Central. Captain Shults was also appointed to the Women in Aviation Advisory Board, an organization that seeks to develop and provide independent recommendations and strategies to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) to inspire young women to pursue flying careers.
