EAA 1268 MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN AND TREASURER REPORT November 2023

One bank deposit was made in October totaling \$2,271.00. Included in the deposit was \$1,100 in donations for the Richard Cooper Memorial Fund, \$20 in dues renewal, \$151 in receipts from our October dinner, and \$1000 from our Saturday BBQ fundraiser. Our CD account earned \$15.83 in interest.

Expenses for the month was one check for \$115 which was reimbursement to our September dinner chef for dinner supplies purchased

Total chapter funds are \$42,168.38 distributed in the following accounts:

CHAPTER PIET BUILDING PROJECT



The Pietenpol fuselage is coming along nicely. Michael asked for a meeting to plan the next stages of construction, so we met recently at the shop hangar to talk about the project.

Yayoi West, Michael Wray, Ron Price, Ray Gallarate and I all met and discussed the engine installation, fuselage building details, and progress inspections as the project continues.

Ray volunteered to ask as the technical advisor, sinc ehis career was in aviation rpair and maintenance. He will be checking in on the buillding session at least once a month to answer questions and discuss possible solutions to any questions that come up.

The project is at the stage that the metal fittings need to be fabricated and installed for the engine, landing gear and wing attachment. I volunteered to order the necessary metal to supplement whatever I have in my hangar, and to work with the project build team members on the fabrication of the fittings.

Chapter 1268 members are encouraged to attend a build session on Saturday mornings and join in with htier skills.

Yayoi is the Chairperson of the Pietenpol Chapter 1268 Build Project in charge of organizing and administration, so contact her with any questions about scheduling. Michael is the Build Team Leader, so he is directing the actual construction.

The team meets every Saturday morning from 9:00 to 11:30 at the clubhouse at Sonoma Skypark. Check with Yayoi to make sure they will eb there before you come out.

EAA CHAPTER 1268 MINUTES

Board of Directors Meeting October 10, 2023

The Board meeting called to order at 6:16 pm. Members present were outgoing Secretary Yayoi West, outgoing President Don Booker, outgoing Treasurer Bill Wheadon, incoming Treasurer Ray Gallarate, incoming Secretary Nelleke Cooper and Vice President Darrel Jones. Also present were Pietenpol Build Team Leader Michael Wray and Marc Ashton from Petaluma Pilot Training Center.

Yayoi West will continue as Pietenpol Project Chairperson in charge of organization and planning.

Michael brought up the issue of who will own the Pietenpol and how will liability be addressed. Ray suggested that the project will need to be sold as-is with the buyer assuming all liability for airworthiness. Consensus is that the Chapter will own the project during construction and that it will be sold as-is upon completion and recommended by Ray. The aircraft will be sold with a formal written sales agreement detailing those requirements. The Chapter will consult with the national EAA office for the means of doing so.

Michael asked about the continued funding for the Chapter Pietenpol build project. Darrel proposed that the Chapter designate \$5,000 from the club treasury to be advanced against the ongoing fundraising for the project so that there would be no delay in the progress of construction. The board voted to approve \$5,000.

Ray informed the Board that a young person from Schellville, Mathew Jackson, is interested in working on the project. The Board asked Ray to encourage him to join the building team, with Michael having the authority to evaluate his suitability and direct his work.

Darrel reported that the new shop gutters and roof repairs were completed at a cost of \$500, which was below the budgeted amount of \$2,500. He also bought a rolling toolbox for approximately \$300 for the loose hand tools donated to the Chapter.

Marc reported that Luis Membrila will need fifty hours before completing his instrument training. PPTC requires that trainees obtain renter's insurance before renting airplanes from the school. Luis may be able to get another PAPA scholarship.

Marc also reported that Hayden Holbrook is getting closer to soloing. Hayden is one of the Chapter's Ray Scholar candidates for 2024.

Darrel reported that Roland is dealing with some health issues and will need to step back from some of his duties for the time being.

The Board Meeting adjourned at 7:00 pm.

Dinner was provided by Marsi Allard and Ligia Booker and consisted of enchiladas with all the trimmings, and flan for dessert.

The General meeting called to order at 7:30 pm

The officers gave their reports to the members. There were no other items brought up for discussion or action, other than an observation by Darrel that the Chapter needs to focus on building our membership in the new year.

General Meeting adjourned at 7:45 pm


